



Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE

2 Kings 4:18-21,32-35,42-44; 5:1-3,10-16

SESSION SUMMARY

In this week's session, we looked at the story of Elisha's ministry. God used Elisha to perform miracles in Israel. Here are some of the main things we learned from his story in 2 Kings:

- Elisha raises a son from the dead (2 Kings 4:18-21,32-35).
- Elisha multiplies bread for the people (2 Kings 4:42-44).
- Elisha heals a skin disease (2 Kings 5:1-3,10-16).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- How can we trust God even when our obstacles seem impossible to overcome?
- How has God given us what we need for each day?
- Naaman had to dip in the river seven times. Why is it important to know God works through processes and we can trust Him as He does?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Do an activity with your student that requires a multistep process. It may be baking a cake, fishing, washing the car, or something like that. The goal is to engage them in the process of the activity and then have a conversation about how God's work in our lives is a process. If we stop at step two or three, we will never get to a fully baked cake or clean car. Like Naaman in 2 Kings 5:1-16, we must trust God at each step and continue even when we haven't yet gotten the results we are hoping for.
