About Baptism and the Christian Faith

In one of Jesus' last earthly times with His followers, He commanded them to "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." – Matthew 28:19

Since that time, baptism has remained a central focus of the Christian Church's work. Baptism makes visible a heart decision and a life work hidden to physical eyes. The act of baptism pictures the identification of the believer with his/her Lord Jesus. Thus, as He lived, died, was buried, and rose from the dead, so in symbolic form the believing Christian participates in that "death" by entering into, and under, the waters of baptism and is then raised up again.

The ceremony which we enact this morning acts as a witness to those who have never asked Jesus to be their personal Savior and Lord. Each of those being baptized bears witness to the work of Jesus in his or her life. Their testimonies are presented below. This time also encourages Christians to remember the wonder of their new lives and to live consistently with their professions of faith.

Jaclyn Berry-Eaton

Before Christ, I was searching many empty avenues for fulfillment. Every path lead to a dead end and more emptiness. I wanted to grow my faith with Christ. I wanted to love and honor my children and my husband and I knew that meant I first needed to begin with loving and honoring Christ. That is why when faced with challenges to my faith in undergrad, I slipped into agnosticism and eventually atheism. By the time I had graduated pharmacy school and entered the Service, I had become an aggressive atheist, harassing coworkers for their beliefs. With no moral compass, I lived a life reveling in sin, specifically pride and sexual immorality.

Eventually, I decided that I wanted a real relationship, so I signed up for online dating. I soon matched with the woman who would eventually become my wife. At first, it didn't matter to me that my wife was a Christian; she could have her beliefs, and I could have mine. Although she never tried to push Christianity onto me, I could tell how important her faith was to her, and as the relationship got more serious, this became more irritating to me.
