MISSIONS UPDATE

Last week we shared about the devastating floods that occurred in Kenya which affected Rift Valley Academy staff, where Mark and Carolyn Kinzer serve. The rain has slowed a bit, but they are still getting nights with 2.5 inches of rain. Several communities around RVA are cut off now with little to no options for getting to the hospital or to work. Water pipes that feed communities from the springs in the forest have been swept away. The expectation is that it will be months before some of these systems are up and running again. We shared a story of Willie, the head mechanic at RVA, and how he and his family were in their home when the flooding wiped away their home and carried them almost two miles in the flooding waters. Willie lost his wife, he and his sons survived but were severely injured. Unfortunately, Willie lost everything they owned. They have no more clothes, housing, furniture, food, and even lost all their official paperwork like birth certificates and licenses. They are now trying to raise funds to pay for the funeral costs for his wife, which are about \$1,000 USD. Willie and his two boys are healing slowly. They have lost everything and don't even have decent clothes to wear to the funeral. Willie's story is happening all over the area south of RVA and affecting many of the staff from RVA. SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

Launch

Describe a time when you challenged someone hastily, in either anger or fear (or both) before seeking the Lord in prayer or the wisdom of others? What went wrong? OR describe the opposite scenario— how did a confrontation bathed in prayer and godly counsel go better than you expected?

· READ Nehemiah 1

Observe

- Compare Nehemiah's prayer with Jesus's In Matthew 6:9-13. What parallels do you see?
- On what basis does Nehemiah appeal to the Lord in His prayer?

Process

What strikes you about Nehemiah's response to the news from Jerusalem?
 How do Nehemiah's actions and his posture demonstrate his sincerity?

Respond

 Have you ever seen a contrast in someone's words of sympathy and their actions or actual response? Have you ever been guilty of such a contrast? Explain.

READ Nehemiah 2:1-5

Observe

 Four months pass before Nehemiah approaches the king. What is his mindset in anticipating this interaction that is clear from verses 1-5?

Process

- These are some of the most vulnerable verses in Scripture. How does Nehemiah's humanity, yet bold faith displayed here, encourage you?
- What does Nehemiah's spontaneous, private prayer in verse 5 say about his relationship with God?

Respond

 Share any specific situations or opposition you're facing; someone you're scared to share the Gospel with, fears or sin struggles, or other situations that this passage speaks to.

READ Nehemiah 2:11-20

Observe

- From what does Nehemiah's' bold assertion in the latter half of this verse claim as its confidence in the first half?
- How has Nehemiah's posture and tone changed from 1:1 to 2:20?

Proces

 How does Nehemiah's "planning in prayer" exhibited in chapter 1, and carried out in verses 1-8 of chapter 2, lead to his confident execution of strategy on the ground in verses 11-18?

Respond

- Do you think people (yourself?) use prayer as an excuse to not take action? If so, why? Explain your answer.
- Discuss the balance we're challenged with in these chapters. When ought we
 pray and wait "four months" like Nehemiah? And when should we get up and
 take action? What other Scriptures come to mind that lend insight and Biblical
 instruction on these ideas?

God's Deliverance Begins and Ends With Prayer

Text: Nehemiah 1 – 2:1-6, 20

"The God of the heavens is the one who will grant us success."

I. Prayer as a Response to Crisis (Nehemiah 1:1-11)

- A. Personal response to corporate disgrace (verse 4)
- B. Nehemiah's Prayer
 - 1. Begins with God (verses 5-6)
 - 2. Is Built on Confession/Humility (verses 6-7)
 - 3. Is Petitioned on God's:
 - a) Promises (verses 8-9)
 - b) Faithfulness (verse 10)
 - 4. Concludes with Supplication (verse 11)

Apply- Where is there "great trouble" in my life? Will I "pray the Gospel of Jesus into this situation?

II. Prayer in the Moment of Action (Nehemiah 2:1-6)

- A. Waiting on God is Good Strategy (1:1a & 2:1a)
- B. Prayer is not a response that justifies inaction:
- 1. Prayer doesn't negate human communication, assessment, & strategy (vs. 3, 5-8)
- 2. Prayer is a fitting response to fear-- even in the moment (verse 4)

Apply- Where have I covered my own inaction with spiritual language?

III. Be a Cupbearer (Nehemiah 2:20)

- A. What is a cupbearer?
- B. To take prayerful action:
 - 1. Seek a clear understanding of the need
 - 2. Adopt personal concern with the need
 - 3. Go to God first with the need
- 4. Be available to meet the need

Apply- Where am I prayerfully planning for moments of influence?
