



Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE

Isaiah 22:8-14; 25:1-5; 30:18-22

SESSION SUMMARY

In this week's session, we looked at God's judgment against Jerusalem for Judah's persistent idolatry. God's correction was also followed by great mercy. Here are some of the main things we learned from the story:

- The Lord judges the wicked (Isa. 22:8-14).
- The Lord rescues the weak (Isa. 25:1-5).
- The Lord restores the wayward (Isa. 30:18-22).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- Why is it important to consider what would honor God in our daily decisions (see Isa. 22:11)?
- How have we experienced God as our refuge?
- How might knowing God's willingness to be reconciled to you affect your willingness to turn to Him when you've failed?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Isaiah 30:21 says, "And whenever you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear this command behind you: 'This is the way. Walk in it.'" Set up a game like pin the tail on the donkey, where one person is blindfolded and must move an object to a specific destination. Then, call out directions to that person to help them get there. Discuss how God's sees what we cannot see. He knows what is ahead, and we need to listen to His guidance for our lives.
