



Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE

Isaiah 44:6–20

SESSION SUMMARY

In this week's session, we considered the futility of idolatry. In the book of Isaiah, God explains why it is unwise to follow idols and how He is the one true God. Here are some of the main things we learned from the story:

- The Lord is the only God (Isa. 44:1-6).
- Idols cannot compare to God (Isa. 44:7-11).
- Idolatry is foolish (Isa. 44:12-20).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- Why can't we serve more than one God with our lives?
- What are some potential idols in our lives?
- How can we put God first over everything else in our lives?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Take four buckets and set them up in a large square outside. Take a fifth bucket and fill it with water. Place the fifth bucket in the middle of the other four and set a cup beside it. Challenge your student to fill up the buckets as high as he or she can with the water from the middle bucket using the cup to transfer water. Afterward, discuss how we have a limited supply of time, commitment, love, and the like. Just like he could not fill up every bucket, or even put water in them at the same time (they had to choose which bucket to fill at any one time), we have to make a choice. We cannot prioritize everything the same. We must give our first and best to God and seek His wisdom for how to divide the rest of our time and resources for His glory.
